

What are the Various Student Government Positions?

While all of these positions carry a significant amount of responsibility, they all have their own sets of standards. Read on to see the similarities and differences.

All Student Government Representatives are responsible for:

- Communicating the ideas and concerns of the student body to the advisors and/or the administration.
- Keeping the student body informed of new ideas and initiatives.

Student Council Representatives are official representatives in Student Council. They help with planning school-wide events. Five representatives from each class will be elected.

Class Officers work closely with class advisors to fundraise for their class and plan events such as the Prom, senior week, and graduation. President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and Secretary are the positions available.

Student Advisory Board members serve as the student body's means of communication with the School Committee. A member of the SAB must be present at all school committee meetings. Five positions are available and open to students currently in grades 9-11.

School Council members work with parents, faculty members and administration to evaluate the school's staff and student's progress, measure successes, review policies and create goals with identified steps to reaching these goals. Two positions are available and open to students currently in grades 9-11.

What Else Should I Know?

Being involved in student government is a difficult but rewarding task to undertake. You will be a leader and decision maker for your class and/or school. It is a challenging experience, but the work you will do will pay off in the end!

Important Steps to Know if you are interested in running

Nomination Forms Become Available TODAY

If you are running as a **student council, student advisory board, or school council representative** you must have 15 of your peers' (of the classes of 2018, 2019, or 2020) signatures and three teachers' signatures.

If you are running for a **class office** you must have 10 of your peers (in your class) signatures (remember – a student may not nominate more than one person per office) and three teachers' signatures. All nominees must make a speech before their classmates on why they should be elected.

Nomination Forms Returned by May 31

Pass in to Ms. Gallagher by 2:15.

Speeches Due June 1

Pass in to Ms. Gallagher by 2:15.
